of hot dogs wrapped in tortillas with of course a little hot salsa.

"I was a Prisoner and You Visited Me"

Everyone knows that old people tell the same stories over and over, but won't you indulge me? It was 1973, and I was invited to speak at a Women's Aglow meeting in Santa Maria, CA. I arrived at my hotel lobby and was greeted by a gentleman who introduced himself and said, "I saw your picture on the religious page. I pray for the special events and those who are ministering in our city. When I saw your picture, God revealed to me that you would be going to prison." He saw the panic on my face and said, "Oh, not as an inmate, but to minister." Either way his statement was outlandish. I was polite, but he interjected, "I felt so strongly about this, I brought you a box of books for distribution to inmates." I thanked him, took the books and excused myself.

On my return home, my son asked, "What are all these books, Mother? They're all the same and they're about prisoners." "Yes," I said, "Some nut in Santa Maria gave them to me. I'll call Art Reardon and see if he can give them out at L.A. County Jail." The prophet and the prophecy were all but forgotten- until 17 years

later. Rev. Percy Gutteridge scheduled an itinerary for me in British Columbia. "What's this," I asked, "You've scheduled me at Matsqui Prison? I'm not going to a prison." He quipped back, "It's scheduled and you've been cleared to minister there." One did not say no to Pastor Gutteridge!

The guards who searched me were not happy about a woman coming to minister in their prison. As gate after gate closed behind me, fear engulfed me. Then God gave me a word: "This is that." I thought of Acts 2, following Pentecost, where Peter said, "This is that." But the word came to me again: "This is that" and I remembered the man in Santa Maria- this was preordained. The auditorium was filled and many were Native Americans. I shared the story of how God had led us to adopt an infant from Oaxaca, resulting in our ministry to the indigenous people of Mexico. I invited the men to come forward for prayer, and at least 40 received Jesus as their Savior.

But the story did not end there. Some years later our son was incarcerated, and we spent the next 18 years visiting him in California prisons. Needless to say, I was not surprised when they built a prison right across the street from the new Mission in Oaxaca, or that some of our precious children's parents are incarcerated behind those walls.

Enrique and Elvira Perez and their team go across that road every day in Oaxaca to bring the love of God. Enrique shares:

"Roberto-Muñoz Flores came down and we prayed for a man who was miraculously healed. He has been released and is now working at a Christian retreat center.

Noe, a Columbian drug dealer, was carrying \$15 million when arrested. He met Jesus behind bars and even carried the Good News to the prison director. His sentence was reduced from 20 years to 2-1/2. Today he's free and ministering as an evangelist."

When inmates are released, Enrique and Elvira make arrangements with local pastors for them to be welcomed into God's family.

Enrique and the team make frequent visits to even the remote areas to bring encouragement. Edmundo, a man Craig Pereau led to the Lord while in prison, is now part of our team in Oaxaca.

Pray with us as they will be going to Mazatlán in Sinaloa to obtain credentials, which will open the doors to federal prisons and the infamous Marias Island Prison.

Report from Angelina Garcia in the medical center: In January our medical team of 12 went to the mountains of Oaxaca. Many patients received medical and dental care, and the Gospel. We also ministered in the prison and at the children's home.

We were blessed with a new dental chair and dental equipment.

Nurses Lynda Vanson and Jessica Brown came to serve and many patients were attended to. The homebound were bathed and received wound care.

Pediatrician, Carey Molberg, came for two weeks.

Dentist, Rick Powell and his wife, Linda Powell, hygienist, came to serve for one month. The children, staff, Bible Institute students, and men from Rancho de Cristo all received care, along with many others from the community.

We still wait, pray and believe that God will send us a doctor.
