When we think about childhood, the images that come to mind are play, fun, games, parents, and siblings. However, when I think of the children in San Pedro Navolato, Sinaloa, I have mental images of streets, abandonment, suicide, abuse, and marginalization.

These children don't have economic or educational resources. They don't have a home, or if they have one, they live crowded among adults who abuse them. They ask for money in the street and are vulnerable to prostitution, abuse, crimes, and even prison. They are children who don't have hope and whose future is similar or even worse than those older than them.

When FFHM began to work in this community with so much lack years ago, we overwhelmed by the reality of those living around us. We didn't take them into account when we were initially planning and looking for ways to serve. It was difficult to see the need in the faces of these little ones that Jesus appreciates. But in some way, we were drawn to them.

These children were "lost," not only in the spiritual sense but also in every aspect: they had no direction. They were indifferent to their lives and didn't feel valuable. We had to go a long way to help them.

Noting that malnutrition limited their potential for growth, we began taking them breakfast in the mornings. Soon we realized this wasn't enough. We had to "be with them." We started to weave ties of friendship, companionship, and of acceptance. We wanted to do this as Jesus did. Jesus took a child in his arms and gave him the possibility of a relationship with the Heavenly Father. Years have passed, and now these little ones participate in the light and the life that Jesus Christ brings.

We have a tremendous responsibility. There is an uncertain future for the children but also there is immense potential in front of us. Our goal is to influence all of this generation of children to choose Christ and that the way they live their lives be plainly Christian.
