Usually, in December, I would share something that is Christmas-themed. But this month, I feel led to share the miracles that God has been doing in His Ministry.

Last year, in obedience to what we felt God had put on our hearts, we moved towards starting a children's home in Tijuana. Government workers had told us that there was nowhere to send children over the age of 12. We accepted this as a challenge to receive teenage girls. Moving forward, we did everything possible on our end. We moved staff from Baja, renovated the building we would use and submitted all necessary paperwork for certification ... then the waiting game began.

The government dragged its feet on completing our certification. They seemed content to leave the girls in the shelter where they were living. However, given the opportunity, our staff began visiting these girls and learned more about them and thier life in the shelter. This is supposed to be a temporary place for children to live until they are placed somewhere else. But some of these girls have been living there their entire life. They never leave the shelter and due to the number of children living there they only have a limited amount of time outside each day. Education stops after eighth grade, and when they turn 18 are required to leave the shelter. Words like "hope" and "future" sound foreign to them.

Once we knew their names, heard their stories, and had their faces in our minds, the need to get the girls into our home became our number one priority - prayer as our greatest weapon.

The month of September was focused on prayer. We had a calendar of daily prayer requests and, each day, our staff and supporters lifted these needs to God. At the end of the month, we had a day of prayer and fasting, where each location joined together to intentionally pray for the ministry's needs -- The very next morning, we found out that we were getting 10 girls from the shelter.

We still hadn't received our certification from the government, and no other circumstances had changed for us - this seemed relatively impossible. But, we know who we serve. We can only attribute it to the impossible God working in His perfect timing.

It is a joy to watch these girls thriving in their new home. They have visited the beach, they have shared their stories as the staff has prayed and cried with them, and each has heard the truth of the Gospel and how much Jesus loves them. I can't wait to see who else God brings into that home and the hope and healing they will also find there.

This is a miracle. And, as I think about this time of year, that's what it is all about - a miracle born into this world so that you and I could have a "hope" and a "future" - that we would know what it means to have a home. We can move forward knowing Immanuel - God with us. Just as He is with the girls in Tijuana, He is with each of us who have called on His name.

Maria is just one of the girls now living with us at the Tijuana Children's Home. When we opened our doors in October, we prioritized taking the girls that had been in the shelter the longest. We are filled with joy and are excited to watch Maria and the others learn how to function in a "family." Our prayer is that they will know more about their Heavenly Father, who has great plans
