
GIVE DIFFERENT THIS CHRISTMAS AND SUPPORT ONE OF THE FOLLOWING 8 AREAS IN HIS MINISTRY:

STAFF SUPPORT:

The staff allows us to have the kingdom impact we long for. They are our most valuable resource since they do the daily work of carrying out our mission. They fill essential roles such as house parents, teachers, missionaries, cooks, and support staff. Some also serve in different leadership roles giving vision and purpose to what we do. Whether it be for a day, month, or year, help us support the cost of staff serving in Mexico.

MISSION NEEDS:

Every month His Ministry sends thousands of dollars to Mexico to meet the basic needs of the different mission locations. These funds cover necessities such as food, water, electricity, gas, car repairs, building maintenance, etc. At times we also have different urgent needs that arise that are covered by these donations. These areas have become more critical and costly with rising inflation in Mexico. Every little bit makes a difference.







SAN OUINTIN DAYCARE:

Four years ago, the government in Baja surprised us with a call offering us a newly built daycare in San Quintin. This building would provide a safe place for the children of field workers to be while their parents were working long hours. We immediately knew that this was a gift from God as it would allow us to create a nurturing environment for children and give us a chance to share Jesus with hundreds of children and their parents. We couldn't have dreamed up a more effective outreach model! We currently have 90 children between 6 months to 6 years old who are cared for, educated, and loved in the name of Jesus.

OUTREACH:

At our locations in Baja, Oaxaca, and Sinaloa, we are sharing the love of Jesus with the people living in the surrounding communities. Whether providing groceries for those in need, feeding breakfast to children in Sinaloa, visiting local prisoners in Oaxaca, doing evangelism and discipleship in the migrant camps, or responding to conditions caused by natural disasters such as earthquakes and hurricanes, these donations allow us to love people in practical ways.



TIJUANA GIRLS' HOME:



After a heartbreaking visit to Tijuana's government shelter, we knew His Ministry needed to respond. The conditions the kids lived in were deplorable, and their futures seemed hopeless. After much prayer and hard work, we opened a home to 15 teenage girls. These girls come with much brokenness and desperately need to know Jesus as their healing Savior. You can be a part of this vital ministry by covering one of their expenses for a day, month, or even a year.

TRANSPORTATION:


We can't do much without each location's cars, minivans, and 15-passenger vans. We are daily transporting children and missionaries. Whether it's for school, doctor's appointments, visiting the camps, encouraging missionaries in remote areas, or attending the local church, we must have reliable transportation to accomplish these things. Most of our vehicles have been donated to us and are already used, and they have taken a beating as they are driven on less-than-adequate roads. We constantly need new or used vehicles for ministry use at all locations.

EDUCATION:

Our schools in Baja and Oaxaca are some of the best around. Approximately 140 children receive a high-quality education while also being taught from a Christian perspective. Many of our children arrive at our homes unable to read or write, regardless of their age. It has also been proven that malnutrition and trauma cause learning delays in children. With these factors, you can understand why our schools are vital to their development. You can send a kid to school for a day, month, or year.

PRESENTS FOR KIDS.

Like most children in the world, our kids love gifts too. Before coming to one of our homes, many of our children have never received a Christmas or birthday gift. A few times a year, we love to think specifically about each child and bless them with something special just for them. At Christmas, we have a tradition at all of our missions of sharing a meal and opening gifts together. With your donation, we can purchase individual gifts for each child to open during these festivities.







OUR LITTLE HELPERS:

The students in Natalie Keller's special education class in Western New York are thrilled to be helping with this year's *Give Different* campaign.
