Six months have passed since I arrived at the mission base in San Pedro Navolato, Sinaloa. The time has gone by very quickly.

My job here in Sinaloa is to do outreach in various migrant camps that we visit during the week. The way we take the word of God to these places is through Bible classes, songs, and games. Occasionally we give out groceries and donations that arrive. My favorite days of the week are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday because I get to spend my time with the children and teens in San Pedro.
