THE SAN QUINTIN DAYCARE REACH THE LOST

This month, I had the chance to sit down with Elizabeth, the new Supervisor of the San Qunitin Daycare, and find out how God is moving in this special place. Elizabeth took over the role as Supervisor seven months ago and is excited about the progress made in many areas of the daycare. Since the pandemic began in 2020, the daycare had taken many precautions to ensure the safety of the staff and children while knowing they needed to remain open. However, with restrictions being lifted, there is a new horizon of possibilities for the short and long-term future. They now care for 90 children, from newborns to six years old.

Since taking over, Elizabeth has taken a particular interest in the health of each student. The children are accustomed to eating beans, tortillas, and fried foods. Much of this is due to the lack of access and resources to secure healthier food options. With the help of our friends at the USANA Foundation, we have been able to secure more fruits and vegetables, making sure that there is one available





at breakfast and lunch for every child. For many of these kids, some of these foods are new, and it has been such a blessing to see them introduced to healthier food options.

Elizabeth shared that they would love to continue doing more in the local community and for the families of the children that attend the daycare. Currently, partnered with our friends at USANA, we have worked with various families providing garden towers with the capability of growing their own fresh fruits and vegetables. They have seen this benefit and reported that some families have grown in excess, sharing with families around them and increasing the accessibility of healthy food options. Likewise, they would like to partner more with the outreach team at the mission, doing team visits and workshops with the families, in order to provide a greater impact in the community and spread the gospel.

Elizabeth shared that she sees God moving in the daycare. She stated that she has an amazing staff who love the kids. However, some of them are not Christians. Through morning prayer and Bible studies with the staff, Elizabeth has seen changes in them, which have an eternal impact on the kids' lives. She can already see how they have opened up more to the gospel, with some having accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior. For her, this is extremely important and is a great encouragement. As she said, our motto is to "be disciples that make disciples." And this is exactly what is happening. They are witnessing the fruits of the harvest through their reflection of Christ.

We discovered the reason was he was embarrassed because he didn't know how to pray. One of the teachers was with him and encouraged him to repeat with the whole group the prayer, and that is how Jesús learned to pray and give thanks for the food.

With a big smile on her face, his grandmother shared in the Tuesday women's discipleship group how in her house, her grandson Jesús says before every meal, "we are going to pray." He reminds them that they should give thanks to God for their food. In the same way, Jesús says "God bless you" to every family member when he is saying goodbye.
