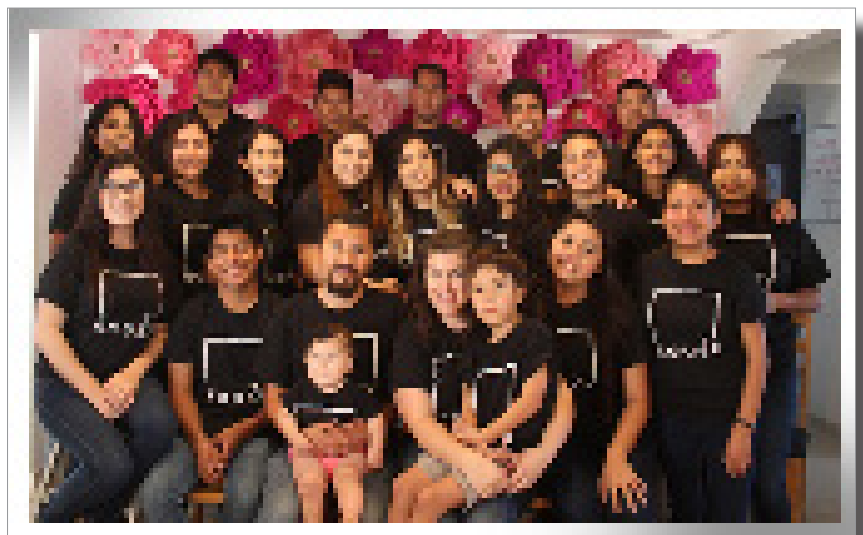
I am so thankful to Foundation for His Ministry and all the people who have helped to give me the incredible opportunities I have been blessed with.

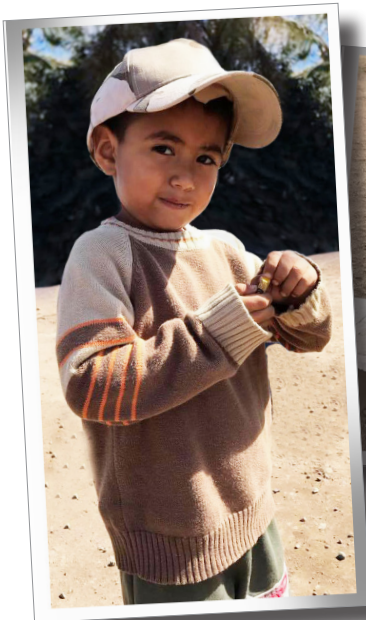
Children

Oaxaca Mission

We have discovered new ways to share God's bounty with those in need around us, through supplying rehabilitation centers and local Bible schools with food staples that they sorely lack. God has produced blessings from the earthquakes last September, opening up connections with new communities from the valley to the isthmus, and even in Chiapas.

The mountain missionaries continue to enter new communities with their ministry teams. They join us once a month so we can learn more about them, the work they are doing, and the ways they see God moving.

And the teenagers here are shining so brightly that other churches are beginning to invite them to their events, in an effort to inspire their own youth. God truly works in wonderful ways.

One of our staff members often says, "We are not a children's home. We are a family." As with many families, life is not all sunshine and roses.

A Vision Realized

The Bible Institute

Recently I had the special privilege of teaching at our Bible Institute. We began by walking from the Mission to the Bible Institute. There are 106 tiles embedded in the concrete, giving the history from creation to Christ's return. The students enthusiastically shared events. It took two hours to walk the 700 feet...the benediction, "even so come quickly Lord Jesus."

I gave the history of the Bible Institute from its inception, on our very first visit to Vicente Guerrero. I said "someday there will be a Bible Institute here like Lutheran Bible Institute, where our lives were changed forever." "Though the vision tarries, wait for it."

In 1988, I was the speaker at Christian Renewal Center, Silver Falls State Park, OR. The founding Pastor Alan Hansen asked, "Didn't your vision include establishing a Bible Institute?" "Well yes but..." Pastor Hansen said, "Terry Yarbrough and I want to help you."

We were given property near the Mission by the river, which had a number of substantial buildings, including a three bedroom house.

Chuck Pereau warned, "**Don't build by that dry river bed.** It is only a matter of time until the flood of the century will wash the buildings into the Pacific." But the buildings were ¼ mile from the river and rock barriers were constructed. In January 1989, all buildings were refurbished and dedicated for the Bible Institute.

In January 1993, the flood of the century came. The massive bridge connecting the north from the south was washed away, as were all Bible Institute buildings. Chuck, who could have said "I told you so," said "We'll rebuild at the Mission."

All but five students returned to their homes; they had no homes to go to. Minerva Trujillo was recruited as dean, under protest, and Jon Cowpersmith was professor. Now 25 years later, all students are in full time service of the Lord Jesus. Glory to God!

Beautiful new buildings were divinely inspired and built by our faithful donors at the Mission.
